

Clint Younge

Clint Younge began his career in the cannabis industry as a budtender and a public relations manager at The Green Cross Dispensary in Vancouver. It was there he learned what it meant to have integrity in business.

After a time with The Green Cross, Clint took a managerial position at The Healing Tree, where he stayed for a year, before what would be the final stop on the way to becoming Chief Executive Officer for MMJ Canada in 2015.

Clint lead a team of over 100 MMJ Canada employees, providing guidance, support and encouragement during difficult and challenging times in an ever-changing industry.

Under the umbrella of MMJ Canada, Clint has been able to help establish local mental health group, The Lost Organization, through endless fundraising and publicity.

Clint resigned from MMJ Canada in October 2018, however he remains active on board of the LOST charity and continues his focus on reasonable access to cannabis for the community.

His efforts in the cannabis industry were recognized in 2017, and 2018 when Clint was recognized as the Cannabis Crusader of the year and Cannabis Influencer at the Canadian Cannabis Awards.
